

**COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR THE GRANTING OF A DOUBLE MASTER'S DEGREE
(SECOND CYCLE DEGREE) IN WOMEN'S AND GENDER STUDIES**

Hereinafter referred as "The Parties" of this Agreement and together forming the GEMMA Consortium.

PREAMBLE

- In June 2009 the University of Granada, Alma Mater Studiorum - Università di Bologna, the Central European University of Budapest, the University of Hull, the University of Lodz, the Institutum Studiorum Humanitatis Ljubiana, the University of Oviedo and the Utrecht University established a Consortium by signing a Cooperation Agreement for the granting of a double Master's Degree (second cycle degree) in Women's and Gender Studies (GEMMA), valid until the academic year 2011/2012;
- the Parties, together with Rutgers the State University of New Jersey as non-awarding institution, then applied for the Erasmus Mundus Programme 2011 call submitting to the European Commission the proposal for the Erasmus Mundus Master's Degree in Women's and Gender Studies (GEMMA) and, since the proposal was selected for funding, in January 2015 they signed a Cooperation Agreement for the running of five editions of the programme GEMMA (the first edition starting in a.y. 2012/13 and the last one starting in a.y. 2016/17).
- Since the collaboration under way and the cultural exchange partnership have given very satisfying results over these years leading to a project of excellence, the Parties agree to continue the cooperation on the programme for four editions, also applying for the Erasmus Plus Programme 2017.
- Associated Partners participate in the Consortium and their specific commitments and obligations will be established in specific agreements between the awarding higher education institutions of the Consortium and each Associated Partner.
- This Agreement shall specify the respective rights and obligations of the Parties with regard to the running of the programme GEMMA. All parties are subject to the rules and regulations set up by the European Commission regarding both the responsibilities towards the European Commission and towards other parties to this Agreement.
- The Parties, with their resources and funds and in accordance with the law and regulations of their respective countries, shall collaborate and host all students, faculty members and administrative staff who participate in the mobility programme as described in this Agreement.

In accordance with the national laws and regulations of the Parties regarding the granting of academic degrees

It is agreed and stipulated as follows:

Art. 1 Preamble and Annexes

Preamble and three annexes (Study Programme, Correspondence table with mobility from/to Bologna and Financial Annex) are an integral part of this Agreement.

Art. 2 Objective of the Agreement

2.1 The Consortium has established an integrated programme of study of 120 ECTS (Annex 1) in the area of Women's and Gender Studies which includes a compulsory period of mobility for students from the Partner Institution chosen as Home University to the Mobility University for a period of at least one semester, and not longer than two semesters.

2.2 Upon the completion of this programme students will receive two second cycle degrees according to the two Programme country Institution chosen (Home and Mobility). Each of the two degrees will be accompanied by a Diploma Supplement and an additional certificate, as described in article 4.9.

2.3 The titles of the degrees awarded upon the completion of this Master's Course will be as follows:

Universidad de Granada: Máster Universitario en Estudios de las Mujeres y de Género

Alma Mater Studiorum - Università di Bologna: Laurea Magistrale in Letterature Moderne Comparate e Postcoloniali

Central European University: Master of Arts in Gender Studies, GEMMA: Women's and Gender Studies specialisation

University of Hull: Masters Degree in Women's and Gender Studies (GEMMA)

University of Lodz: Master in International Relations (International Gender Studies)

Universidad de Oviedo: Máster Universitario en Estudios de las Mujeres y de Género

University of Utrecht: Master Degree in Arts and Culture (research) (Gender Studies)

2.4. Where necessary under national or local regulations, the student should apply for the degree to be issued by submitting the relevant academic documentation and paying any applicable fees at the Home and Mobility institution.

Art. 3 Organization of the Consortium

3.1 GEMMA Coordinating Institution

The Coordinating Institution of the Consortium is the University of Granada. The University of Granada will provide the necessary technical and administrative support for the coordination of the GEMMA programme.

The GEMMA Consortium Scientific Coordinator and the local Scientific Coordinator for the GEMMA programme in Granada are both based at the University of Granada Women's Studies Institute.

3.2 GEMMA Partner Institutions



At each Partner University there is a Scientific Coordinator responsible for the GEMMA programme.

3.3 GEMMA Steering Committee

The GEMMA Steering Committee is composed of GEMMA Scientific Coordinators from all Partner Universities and presided by the GEMMA Consortium Scientific Coordinator.

Art. 4 Students

4.1 Selection of candidates

Common standards of admission, a common on-line application procedure, and joint student selection have been organized. Students admitted to the integrated study programme are selected by the GEMMA Steering Committee. This Committee acts on the advice of a preliminary screening of applicants, carried out at the Coordinating Institution according to strictly technical criteria of eligibility.

Each candidate must necessarily hold a University Bachelor's degree or its equivalent (180 ECTS, minimum 3 years of study), and be able to prove their knowledge of the languages of instruction of the Home and Mobility University. The selection criteria include academic excellence, relevant experience in the field of Gender and Women's Studies, and proven knowledge of one or more of the Consortium languages (Spanish, English and Italian).

Selection of Erasmus Plus scholarship holders is carried out according to the specific procedures established by the GEMMA Consortium at the GEMMA Steering Committee Selection Meeting.

4.2 Registration and Enrolment

Students register through the Coordinating Institution, the University of Granada. The students are provided with the registration form in electronic format which includes core and elective modules for all Consortium Universities. They fill out the form, registering in the chosen courses offered at their Home/Mobility University, sign it and send it back to the Coordinating institution.

Once at the Home University, students must fulfil the local administrative obligations for enrolment in this University, becoming official students of the institution in question. During the mobility period students from partner institutions are registered by the Mobility University according to its regulations. Students shall be likewise subject to the regulations and norms which are in force in the Mobility University.

Students must acquire 120 ECTS credits including the compulsory mobility period at one of the Partner Universities. A minimum of 30 and a maximum of 60 ECTS credits must be acquired at the Mobility University. The mobility route of each student must always include two universities based in two different programme countries, with a minimum of 30 ECTS to be completed in each of them.

4.3 Language Policy

Students must have sufficient knowledge of the languages of instruction at their Home and Mobility University (English, Italian or Spanish).

The language of study and assessment may be Italian, Spanish or English according to the language of study at the institution in which the candidate is studying, and in which the credit will be awarded.

The Parties will endeavour to provide language acquisition support for students participating in the mobility scheme, offering possibilities to take courses in the language spoken in the country of mobility or the language of instruction at the Mobility institution.

4.4 Student Exchange

Where possible, the exchange should be balanced and involve an equal number of students from each of the above mentioned Universities.

Each academic year, the Universities involved will agree upon the number of participating students. Any excess to this number must be approved of by the Parties.

The Mobility of European Students may be financed through the Erasmus Plus Scholarship scheme. For this purpose, the European Partners have signed specific Erasmus Bilateral Agreements reserving scholarships for European GEMMA Students.

European Students regularly participating in the GEMMA programme may apply for an Erasmus Plus scholarship at their Home University, following the specific rules of their sending institution.

GEMMA Coordinators will provide students with specific information on the Erasmus Scholarships available and the necessary administrative procedures in due time each academic year.

4.5 Examinations and Certifications

The GEMMA partner universities will mutually recognize all examinations successfully passed by students at another partner university.

The Mobility University shall issue each student with a certificate indicating courses attended, academic performance, and the number of ECTS credits obtained. The responsibility for producing and issuing clear transcripts of grades and final degree certificates lies with the awarding institution.

4.6 Boards of examiners and master's thesis

Each teaching institution will be responsible for holding a board of examiners meeting in accordance with its own framework. It is desirable for members of other institutions to be represented at and involved in other boards. This will, however, depend on the local regulations of the universities.

Assessments taken at each institution will be examined in accordance with the regulations for boards of examiners at the awarding institution. Assessment grades, transcripts and relevant reports will be shared with the GEMMA Steering Committee.

Dissertations will be primarily supervised by nominated teaching staff at the institution awarding the credit for the Master's Thesis. An additional "support" supervisor from the candidate's Partner (either Home or Mobility) University will liaise with the main supervisor and present their report on the dissertation. Reports on dissertations should be in accordance with the regulations of the institution where the dissertation is to be submitted. The final assessment of the Master's Thesis should take into account the grades recommended by both main and support supervisors.

4.7 University facilities

Students will be treated in accordance with the regulations and procedures of their Home University. They will have access to all the facilities offered to postgraduate students at their teaching institution, including the facilities in place to support students with specific needs and disabilities. These facilities and services will be made clear to students by their Home Institutions at the beginning of their period of study.

Students have the right to a process of induction and supervision at their Home Institution, although these processes may vary among institutions.

Students involved in the mobility programme shall benefit from all student services and facilities offered by the Mobility University to its regular students and shall likewise be subject to the regulations and norms which are in force at that Institution.

4.8 Tutors

For each student, the Home and the Mobility University will appoint a tutor, whom the student may consult for advice or assistance during their stay at the Institution, and in order to allow teaching staff to monitor the students' progress.

4.9 Double Degree Delivery

Students admitted to the Master's Degree programme, having successfully completed the integrated study programme as described in this Agreement and Annexes in both the Home University and Mobility Institution, will be awarded independent degrees from the two institutions. Each degree is recognized in the country where it has been issued as well as by the whole Consortium.

Each degree will be accompanied by the corresponding Diploma Supplement issued in accordance with national or local legislation and regulations in each case.

An additional certificate, designed especially for the GEMMA Master's Degree will further certify that the separate degrees have been awarded in the framework of GEMMA.

4.10 Participation costs and financial arrangements

Participation costs required from students will be 9.000 EUR for Partner Country students and 4.500 EUR for Programme Country students. Participation costs include tuition fees and other costs such as insurance costs, costs for the Summer School, costs to cover GEMMA fund, coordination costs, etc. Consortium Grants to waive part of these participation costs will be given to students not holding EM scholarships.

The Consortium will subsidize students by offering participation grants to a number of non-scholarship holders (both from Partner and Programme Countries) who have been accepted in the programme. For every edition of GEMMA the exact number of GEMMA granted students shall be decided at the January selection meeting of the previous academic year. The grants will waive the participation costs of the amount of 3.500 euros for Partner Country students and 2.400 euros for Programme Country students.

Participation costs are paid by all students (regardless of the mobility route assigned to them) to the Consortium Coordinating Institution, the University of Granada, which then pays each member of the Consortium their share.

The University of Granada will allot the shares of the participation costs among the partner Universities and manage them according to the criteria agreed upon by the Contractors as described in the attached financial annex (Annex 3).

The flat rate per edition from the Erasmus+ Programme (lump sum) is paid to the Coordinating Institution. Once the amount destined to the financing of at least 4 scholars' mobility is deducted this flat rate will be used for the funding of the annual Consortium meetings and for partially sponsoring the contract of the consortium technical coordinator.

4.11 Appeals and complaints

Students will be entitled to the rights of appeal afforded under the regulations of the Home institution.

The GEMMA Steering Committee must consider the variability and comparability of appeals and complaints regulations across the Consortium. Each partner must have access to information and regulations of other partner institutions in this regard, in order to ensure that there is some comparability between partners.

Any contractual relationship is between the student and the teaching institution and therefore subject to the law of the jurisdiction in which that institution operates.

4.12 Insurance obligation

Partner Universities state that their respective regularly admitted students should be insured against any incident that they may suffer during their period of stay abroad for the activities concerned by this Agreement and that they should be insured for legal liability against damage which they may involuntarily cause to third parties (people or property). Should students not be covered by the Mundus scholarship-related insurance scheme or the respective University's insurance scheme, they will be responsible for taking out their own insurance.

Art. 5 Study programme

5.1 Programme overview

The common integrated study programme (Annex 1) and the correspondence table with mobility from/to Bologna (Annex 2) is attached to this Agreement.

In the first semester, three core modules totalling 30 ECTS credits common to all Partner Universities (Feminist History, Feminist Theory, and Feminist Methodology) will be run for all the students to guarantee a comparable basic education.

In the second and third semesters the Parties will offer various elective courses to the students.

In the fourth semester the students will prepare and submit a Master's Thesis either at the Home or Mobility University.

5.2 Study programme formulation

The Universities formulate and approve through their respective academic bodies all study programmes, properly organized into semesters, modules and credits (ECTS). Study programmes shall cover the whole period from the beginning of study to the last exams, for the obtention of the degree.

Common study programmes may include specific teaching, given the multinational nature of the course, as well as an internship at private companies and/or public administrations.

Examinations and study periods shall be organized in a balanced form and shall find justification and validation in Partner Universities, according to the provisions of the attached study programme.

5.3 Programme approval, monitoring and review

The GEMMA Steering Committee will facilitate cross-institution consideration (especially in terms of considering comparability of standards, comparability of the learning experience, and further strengthening of the partnership among the institutions).

The programme is subject to review by all Universities of the GEMMA Consortium as part of their ongoing periodic review processes. This process should be coordinated, as far as possible, by the GEMMA Steering Committee.

Art. 6 Exchange of faculty members and administrative staff

6.1. Exchange modalities

All the partner Universities shall regulate the reception and conditions of faculty members and administrative staff participating in the mobility programme under this Agreement, in accordance with legislation and regulations in force in the country concerned.

Personnel exchanged under this Agreement shall continue to fulfil their contractual obligations with their Home University, and shall continue to receive the remuneration due and to benefit from the rights they are entitled to in accordance with their post, in compliance with legislation or regulations existing in their home country.

In all cases and to all effects, the Home University shall consider the duration of the stay as an ordinary service period.

Coverage of expenses incurred due to the mobility of teaching staff and administrative personnel will be negotiated between the partner universities and will depend on the availability of funds.

6.2 Activities for teaching staff and administrative personnel

Faculty members and researchers may give courses and lectures, carry out tutorial activities, participate in seminars, act as members of examination and take part in research activities and meetings for student exchange programme planning, evaluation and development, held at the partner University.

Administrative staff may participate in meetings for student exchange programme planning, evaluation and development, and carry out special visits in order to analyze the management systems operating at the partner University.

6.3. Insurance obligation

Partner Universities state that their employees and staff (teachers and administrative personnel) should be insured against any incident that they may suffer during their period of stay abroad for the activities concerned by this Agreement and that they should be insured for legal liability against damage which they may involuntarily cause to third parties (people or property). Should staff not be covered by the European Commission or the respective University's insurance scheme, they will be responsible for taking out their own insurance.

Art.7 Risk prevention and safety

Each party shall supply each mobility programme participant with detailed information about the specific risks existing in the work environment in which they will operate and carry out their function, and with necessary documentation about risk prevention and emergency safety measures and provisions in force in relation to their activity, as well as about the individuals in charge of these provisions, in accordance with legislation and regulations in force in the country of the hosting University.

Art. 8 Other activities

Partner Universities may extend the cooperation agreement for other purposes beyond student and staff exchange. Further cooperation projects, including intensive courses, distance teaching, joint research, organization of seminars, symposia, and interviews on topics of common interest, publication series and all other activities consolidating the cooperation with associate partners and within the consortium as contemplated in the Action 1 project will be encouraged by all parties. These projects will be subject to specific addenda to this Agreement document, at the proposal of the Parties.

Art. 9 Monitoring of the Agreement

Each University shall appoint a person responsible for the monitoring of this cooperation agreement, in accordance with its internal regulations; under normal circumstances it should be the local Coordinator of the programme.

Art. 10 Quality assurance and evaluation of the program

The Programme Country Institutions will use similar quality assurance procedures, as far as possible according to local and national rules, and they will be consistent in their application. Five types of procedures are considered:

First: Assurance of the quality of the learning and teaching processes:

- a) The selection of the scholars is based on criteria of eminence and competence.
- b) The selection of the students is based on criteria designed to guarantee their adequate preparation and motivation to follow the Master programme.
- c) Full time dedication of the students is required.
- d) An induction session will take place in every partner institution to adequately inform, orient and motivate the students.
- e) Continuous tutoring and guidance systems will be implemented in every partner institution.
- f) A clear and planned strategy will be implemented in every partner institution to develop both research and professional competences.

Second: Assurance of the quality of the processes involved in the evaluation of the students' performance:

- a) The continuous standardisation of evaluation criteria. Although examinations and other work assignments will follow the procedures and rules of the institutions, the Parties will continue to develop mechanisms to unify evaluation criteria among teaching staff pertaining to the different partner institutions.
- b) The specific examination of research and professional competences with formative feedback to the students.

c) The evaluation of the integration of research and practice.

Third: Evaluation of quality by students and teaching staff

a) Quantitative and qualitative evaluation of the quality of the training will be performed by students and teaching staff following procedures and rules of each partner institution.

b) Specific evaluation of the support the student receives during the preparation of research documents (project and manuscript).

Fourth: Quality assurance of coordination and management by means of the coordination system.

a) Coordination and management using the different instruments and by means of different coordination activities (meetings, etc.) will assure the quality of the master and continuous improvement mechanisms.

Art. 11 Resolution of conflicts arising

In the event of any conflict arising from this agreement the Parties will endeavour to resolve the matter amicably and in good faith.

Art. 12 Duration of the Agreement

The Agreement will be valid from academic year 2017/18 for a period of 4 academic years (the last cohort of students will enroll in academic year 2020/2021). This Agreement may be terminated at the request of one of the Parties provided that a minimum of one year prior written notice is given to the other Parties to enable satisfactory arrangements to be put in place for existing students, and those to whom an offer of a place on the programme has been formally made. All Parties shall be equally responsible for such arrangements.

Any modification or termination of the Agreement shall be carried out in such a way as to ensure no damage for the participants in the programmes already underway. If any of the partner institutions wishes to withdraw, it must be guaranteed that all the students admitted to this institution will be able to complete their studies and graduate within a reasonable period of time.

Art. 13 Copies and language

This Agreement is written and undersigned in eight identical originals in English, all of which are to be given equal legal consideration. At the request of the Coordinating Institution, there will also be a Spanish language version for information purposes.

Art. 14 General conditions

The provisions of this Agreement concerning the commitments towards the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) and those resulting from the obtaining of funding EMJMDP, will be valid and executive from 2017/2018 only in case the project Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree GEMMA will be selected for funding under the Erasmus Plus Programme 2017- Key Action 1.

ANNEX 3 - Financial Annex

This Annex to the Cooperation Agreement for the Granting of a Double Master's Degree in Women's and Gender Studies, negotiated among the UNIVERSITY OF GRANADA, Spain, the UNIVERSITY OF BOLOGNA, Italia, the CENTRAL EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY, Budapest, Hungary, UNIVERSITY OF HULL, United Kingdom, UNIVERSITY OF LODZ, Poland, UNIVERSITY OF OVIEDO, Spain, and UTRECHT UNIVERSITY, The Netherlands, formalizes the acceptance of financial conditions of organization of the Consortium.

1. Participation costs

1.1 Participation costs are paid by all students of the GEMMA programme to the University of Granada, which then pays each member of the Consortium their share.

1.2 Participation costs will be €9,000 per academic year for Partner Country students and €4,500 for Programme Country students.

1.3 Participation costs include tuition fees and other costs such as insurance costs, costs for the Summer School, costs to cover GEMMA fund, coordination costs etc. Consortium Grants to waive part of these participation costs will be given to students not holding EM scholarships.

1.4. The Consortium will subsidize students by offering participation grants to a number of non-scholarship holders (both Partner Country and Programme Country) who have been accepted in the programme. For every edition of GEMMA the exact number of GEMMA granted students shall be decided at the January selection meeting of the previous academic year. The grants will waive the participation costs of the amount of €3,500 for Partner Country students and €2,400 for Programme Country students.

1.5 Erasmus Mundus scholarship holders have to enroll regularly, although, their participation cost is automatically deducted from the Erasmus Mundus grant received and transferred to their Home or Mobility University.

1.6 Students participating in the mobility period will pay the whole amount of the participation cost to the Coordinating Institution. This amount will be transferred to their Mobility/Home University according to the number of semesters spent at each institution.

1.7 All other charges, including health insurance, shall be borne by the students themselves, with the exception of Erasmus Mundus scholarship holders whose insurance will be paid by the GEMMA Consortium out of the total grant received from the European Commission.

2. Consortium Finances

2.1 General rules

Finance management is done according to the general criteria established in the Erasmus Mundus program, as well as the specific mechanisms agreed in the GEMMA project and other agreements carried out by the GEMMA Consortium.

The University of Granada is the Coordinating Institution as well as the host of the project. Therefore the registration and payment of fees of all the GEMMA students takes place through this institution.

2.2 GEMMA Accounts

All funds obtained from the European Commission, including scholarships and funds assigned by the European Commission for coordination expenses, **will be received at the Coordinating Institution** and the corresponding shares of these funds will be transferred to Partner Universities, as applicable. The European Commission assigns a lump-sum contribution of €50,000 per edition for the expenses of the coordination of this Master's programme and the scholars' mobility. Moreover, it assigns the Erasmus Mundus scholarships for all the grantees of this program (this amount includes the participation fees as well as the scholarship installments).

2.3 Distribution of the funds obtained through the participation (costs):

The University of Granada transfers to each Partner University their share of participation (costs), corresponding with the number of students regularly enrolled at each Institution (Programme Country and Partner Country). It is agreed by the Consortium that the University of Granada shall receive the amount of €700 from the costs of each Partner Country student enrolled for the GEMMA Master's Degree programme at any partner university. This amount will cover the costs of the consortium coordination, and in particular will ensure technical coordination of the consortium, preferably through the employment of a full-time administrative officer.

Once the amounts destined for the Coordination of the Consortium, the Consortium fund and the insurance policies have been covered from the total participation costs, the University of Granada will share out the participation costs to each partner university as follows: 4.800 €/unit for a full year/2400€ semester for each Partner country student regularly enrolled; For programme country students 2.100€ will go twice (for the two academic years of the duration of the programme) to the home institution. The latter complies with the established rules for Erasmus+ exchanges reflected in the bilateral agreements between European universities, according to which fees are always paid to the home institution.

2.4 Available funds managed by the Consortium

The UGR, as GEMMA project coordinator receives a lump-sum contribution to management costs and scholars' mobility of €50,000. This lump-sum contribution shall cover the mandatory mobility of a minimum of 4 scholars and shall also serve to finance the regular meetings of the Scientific Coordinators of the programme. A GEMMA fund shall be set up to respond to further consortium needs and shall be calculated on the number of EM scholarship holders on a price per unit of €2,900 per scholarship holder Partner Country student. This fund will help meet any possible shortfall due to the gradually diminishing number of EM scholarships and pay for other costs such as: Helping those partners whose fees exceed the EM maximum contribution to participation costs; - Organizing joint activities such as the biennial GEMMA graduation ceremony and joint summer schools; - Sponsoring a GEMMA research and teaching book series with an annual publication of GEMMA results; - Publishing an annual selection of GEMMA master theses; - Financing staff mobility; - Contracting extra administrative personnel at the Coordinating/partner Institution; - Maintaining and updating the GEMMA web page; - Allocating compensatory grants for disadvantaged students; - Paying for extra language courses. Each year at its spring meeting, the consortium will jointly decide how best to allocate the amounts belonging to this fund.

Other Partner Universities of the Consortium will receive from the University of Granada the funds corresponding to the participation fees of Programme Country, as well as Partner Country students, after the amount destined for the Coordination of the Consortium mentioned above has been deducted.
