She has also helped me with interlibrary loans, which in a couple of cases was really important for my current research. Finally she has helped me to get to know Miami better. Activities: My stay in Santa Domingo at the Centro de Estudios de Genero, INTEC, has been most fruitful. The following activities, which made the trip worthwhile, are worth mentioning: The coordinator of Gender Studies, dr. Desiree del Rosario, was very friendly and helpful. We had several meetings, also with other collaborators of the department, and with other GEMMA fellowship holders from the University of Granada, e.g. dr Carmen Gregorio Gil, in which experiences were exchanged about the development of Gender studies in our various sites. Advise was sought and given on the further development of Gender Studies at INTEC. I gave a public presentation on August 11, entitled "Soy Moneda de Oro; la Cultura Sexual de las Mujeres Carribeñas" at INTEC, devoted to my work: the existence of a Caribbean sexual culture among women. This talk was well attended, by approximately 80 persons, students of Gender Studies, but also of other disciplines, deans and professors of INTEC. The talk was in English and an interpreter was provided. I later heard that the talk was well -received and followed up by conversations in various classes. In light of the fact that sexuality is a rather taboo topic, this can only be called a welcome result. I have been able to make observations of daily life, of gender and sexual relations, of the place of race, some of which I also shared in my - aforementioned - talk. Though there may not be an immediate further use for these observations (but see pt 6), for me an important and enriching part of this fellowship was the opportunity to comparatively study a Spanish-speaking part of the Caribbean, because so far I had spent time in the Dutch-, French- and English speaking Caribbean. I am certain, however, that this experience will come to fruition in future publications. My Spanish has improved significantly during the four weeks of my stay. The down side, however, was that very few people spoke English, making conversations and exchange, certainly in the beginning, rather difficult. I have read and annotated modern literature written in and about the Dominican Republic, including Mario Vargas Llosa's The Feast of the Goat, Edwige Danticat's The Farming of Bones, Julia Alvarez', The Time of the Butterflies, How the Garcia Girls lost their Accents and My name is Salomé and Junot Diaz' The brief, wondrous Life of Oscar Wao. I wrote a cycle of Dutch poems on the Dominican Republic and there still seems to be no end to this production, pointing to the deep impressions I carried with me from my stay.

Apart from that I had bi-lateral meetings and conversations with Yana Rodgers, Josephine Diamond (on postcolonial literature), Judy Gerson (on gender and trauma research), Ed Cohen (on masculinities studies and AIDS research), Joanna Regulska (on migrations studies), Charlotte Bunch (on transitional justice). During my stay I also met other visiting scholars and

discussed their projects like the CEU researcher's project on post-socialist films in central Europe. A happy coincidence was the fact that the PEN congress was taking place in NY which worked out very well in term of my current research. I had some interesting conversations with among others Toni Morrison and Marlene van Niekerk on postcolonial literature. I started the preparations for an article on the Truth and Reconcilliation Commission of South Africa and the way in which some of the victims' stories occur to have become icons in SA's cultural practices like literature and visual arts. This article will be published in a special edition of the Journal of Memory Studies. I immensely profited from the opportunity to be in an other environment, speak to colleagues about both managerial and theoretical issues and used the time to refill my intellectual battery.
